#### NOTES

1. Fees should not be sent with applications for blocks.
2. Permits are personal and non-transferable but if on receipt of this intimation a second gun or guns are nominated by the applicant for the permit and if their fees are remitted together with his own, they will all be considered by names as joint holders of the permit.
3. No fees will be refunded under any circumstances once a permit has been issued.
4. A permit for a shooting block carries no permission to use Forest Rest Houses in that block. It often happens that a shooting permit-holder cannot be given permission to occupy a Forest Rest Houses as it may be required for officer touring on duty. Shooting permit-holders are, therefore, advised to be prepared to camp in tents during the period of their shooting-permits. If the use of a Forest Rest House is desired, application should be made to the Divisional Forest Officer not more than 21 days before the date on which a permit starts.
